artistree outreach

In the mid-1990s, the Hartford School District established the Wilder School to serve students from nine supervisory unions in Vermont and New Hampshire. Wilder provides specialized programs for children with autism and for students with severe emotional disabilities. For many years, however, one thing was missing: the arts.

In 2008, Artistree Executive Director Kathleen Dolan began volunteering at the Wilder School.

At the time, Wilder had no arts programming and almost no art supplies. Each week, Kathleen packed her car with everything she needed—baskets of materials, folding tables, and tools for projects ranging from mosaic and printmaking to wood sculpture—and brought a complete art classroom to the school. As Artistree’s current Outreach Coordinator, Finnie Trimpi, recalls, “She would essentially bring an entire classroom to and from the school weekly to offer arts experiences.”

Kathleen, who holds a degree in art therapy, created highly structured, student-centered classes designed for success. Students had control over their creative process and final product—an empowering experience for young people who often had little control in other areas of their lives. Elementary, middle, and high school groups each had their own weekly class to explore, experiment, and express themselves.

As Artistree grew, the organization recognized both the need and the impact of the program. Staff members began teaching at Wilder on a rotating schedule, formally launching what would become Artistree’s Outreach Program: bringing arts education directly into community spaces for those who might not otherwise have access.

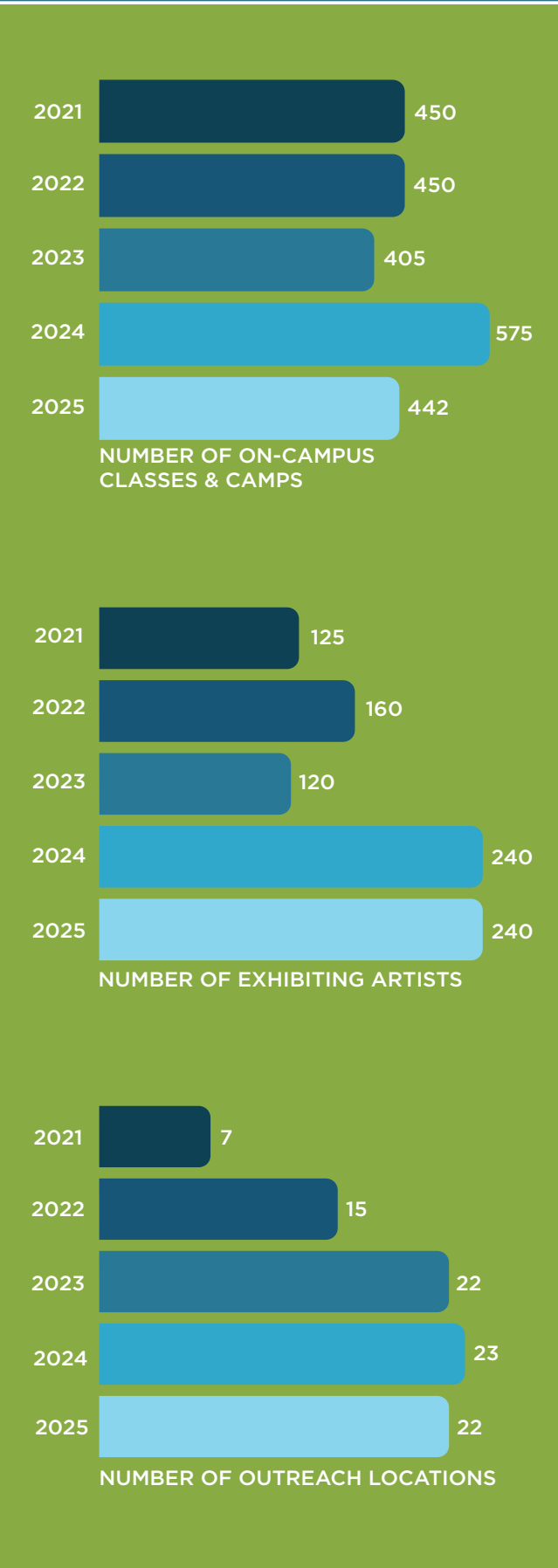
Today, the story has come full circle. This year, Wilder added a dedicated art teacher to its budget. Arts educator Emily Burkholder—also an Artistree instructor—now teaches art directly at the school. After nearly 20 years, Artistree has proudly passed the torch, knowing the arts are now a permanent part of the Wilder community.

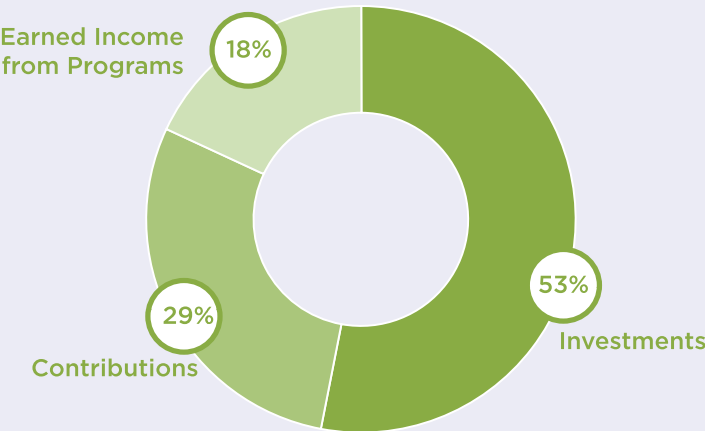

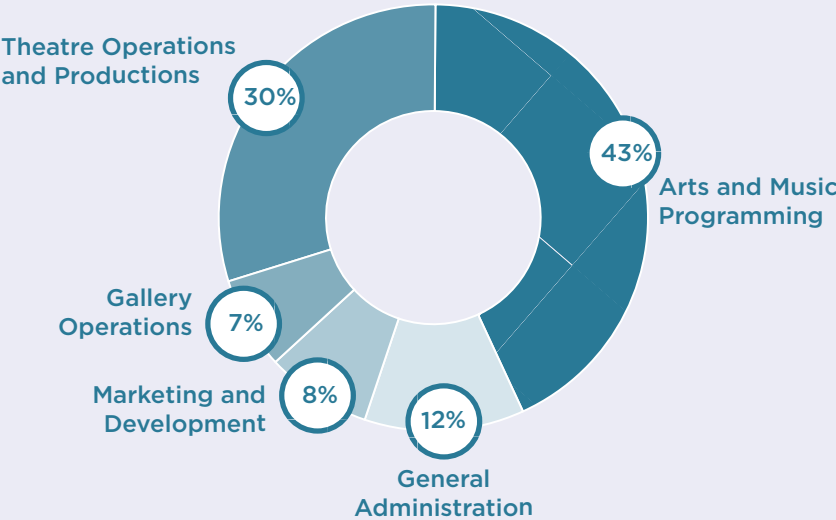

ANN & BOB QUASMAN: Investing in Community

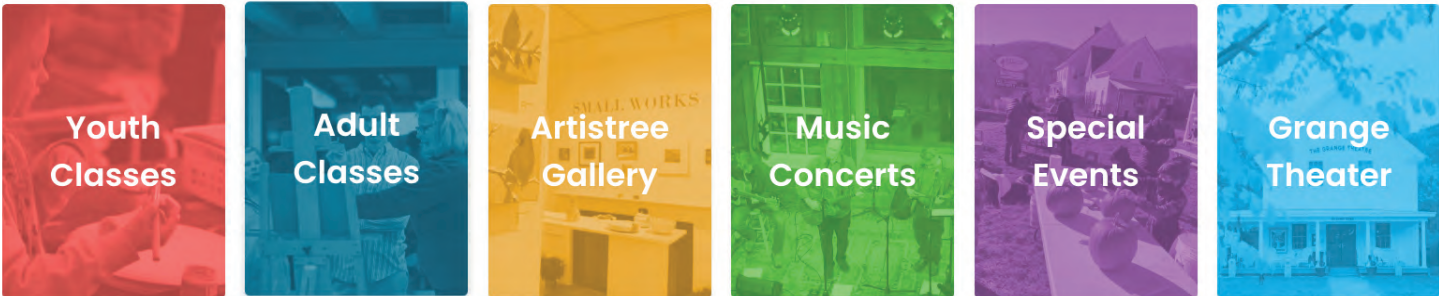

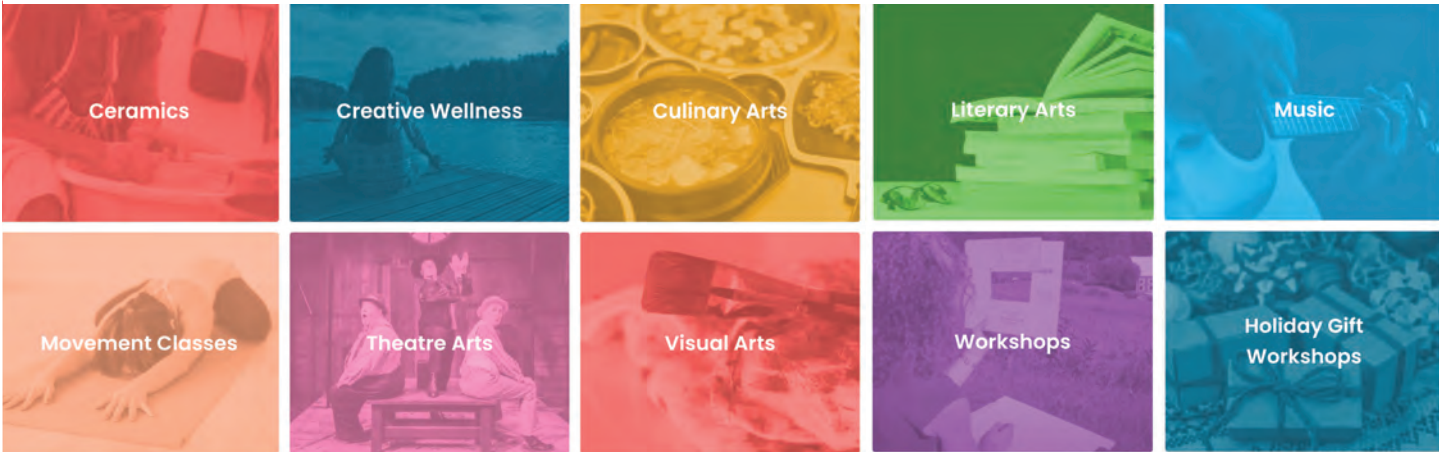
For Ann and Bob, the gift is rooted in gratitude and connection. The couple moved to Woodstock in 2014 after years of visiting the area for biking trips from their home outside Baltimore. Soon after arriving, Ann began taking classes at Artistree—especially pottery—as a way to meet people and connect with the community.

Their decision to make a transformational gift crystallized at a donor appreciation gathering in October, when Bob was struck by a photograph of a woman with developmental challenges engaged in making art. The moment reinforced something they had been thinking about for some time: they wanted their philanthropy to be local, tangible, and impactful.

At its heart, their gift reflects deeply held values. “Kindness,” Ann says simply. “We’re fortunate to be in a position to give back.” Through their generosity, Ann and Bob are helping ensure that Artistree can continue to expand access to creativity, connection, and community for years to come.

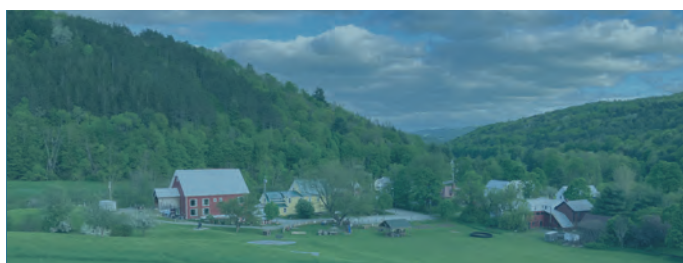
